

A late Asa Hall header claimed a crucial point for the Yellows. The game took place in and out of showers in the first half, followed by a strong and blustery wind after the break. The conditions were interchangeable and had some bearing on the eventual result.

Tiverton welcomed back Aiden Horne and John Ross made his competitive debut in goal, with George Burton unavailable and Brooklyn Wilkins dropped to the bench, where he was joined by new loan signing from Weston-super-Mare Josh Salmon and the returning Dean Moxey. The management team opted for what resembled a wing-back system, in which Tor Swann and Corey Koerner took up the wide positions, with a central three comprising of Matt Wood, captain Toby Down and player-manager Asa Hall. The middle of midfield was occupied by Toby Stephens and Gabe Billington, with Aiden Horne ahead of them and Dan Koita and Louis Jagger Cane in the striking roles.

Newcomers to the division, London side
Uxbridge travelled to Devon protecting an
unbeaten seven game start to life in
Southern League Premier South, this being
an impressive run that included five draws.
When proceedings got underway, it was the
visitors who settled quickly and Tivvy who
faced plenty of pressure on their goal. This
being a combination of fluent attacking
play from the Reds and the Yellows
creating problems of their own, through
sloppiness in and out of possession and


Uxbridge's seventh minute opener owed as much to the latter, as the former and at least two efforts had been fired wide of the Yellows goal, before they went in front.

When they took control of the ball in the middle of the park, gaps alarmingly appeared in Tivvy's rearguard, as the Reds menacingly pushed forward and time was afforded to both provider and the scorer Harry Rush, as it opened up all too easily for the visitors.

It looked like it was going to be a long afternoon for Tivvy as Danny Edwards side continued in the ascendancy with shots flashing wide and Ross by far the busier of the two keepers, in a difficult opening. There was undoubted quality in the visitors' team, but equally the Yellows weren't at the races, early doors.

Asa Hall and Steve Orchard's men, however, did grow into the game after being outplayed and outfought, with half of the first 45 complete. A questionable booking for Dan Koita after 29 minutes after good forward play that saw him beat his man along the byline, was picked up when a whole- hearted clearance from captain CJ Fearn saw the ex-Farnborough man, get to the ball ahead of him. The momentum of Koita's run meaning he couldn't put the brakes on. Fearn fell to the ground and stayed down and the referee brandished a rather harsh Yellow.

As the Yellows started to see more of the ball, Aiden Horne began to regularly glide past players in the final third and only drastic defending, sometimes at the cost of a free kick stopped him entering the box. Swann and Horne were causing the main issues for the away side to deal with, committing defenders and driving forward.

Despite being in the clear, the talented frontman Koita was one-on-one in the 40th minute with the Reds keeper who was able to save in the middle of his goal, as he couldn't find the corner. Then from a very well delivered in swinging corner from Koerner, Hall wasn't far away with his header. On the verge of half time the impressive Horne slalomed past a couple of Uxbridge players before letting fly. It was a decent attempt that needed good handling, and the keeper was equal to the task.

This was a very watchable and entertaining half for the neutral, although for the majority of it we looked vulnerable in our final third and were perhaps fortunate to not be further behind after the opening twenty minutes. When the Yellows returned to the field of play, a strong wind made playing conditions challenging. Our opponents having slightly the better of the play at the beginning of the second period and they are a good footballing side, as they continued to demonstrate.

As a spectacle after the break, as both defensive units tightened up, it became a bit of a war of attrition, with the strength of the wind being more potent than both teams. Koita's header on 55 minutes was deflected behind for a corner and then another one followed as Uxbridge cleared to safety. In the 63rd minute a second goal for the visitor's was ruled out for a handball. Moments later Steve Orchard replaced Jagger Cane with debutant Weston-super-Mare loanee Josh Salmon.

Finn Rooke and Jacob Wellington came on for Koita and Horne, as Tiverton looked to come on strong in the closing stages. The determination of both sides overspilled into a brief physical altercation involving Fearn and Rooke. Yellows were given to each of them.

With time running out, in the 89th minute Stephens free kick in rode on the wind and with Rooke making a nuisance of himself in the six-yard box, the ball went above him and on to Asa Hall at the back post. The player-manager is often a scorer of crucial goals for the Yellows, and he calmly headed into the back of the net, to set up a tense finale.

Added time though, not through want of trying from either side went without further addition to the scoreline and Tiverton had dug in to gain a vital point, which was the difference between them being in 16th or in the relegation places. The Yellows displayed a lot of character in a game where they weren't at their best and this mentality will be required going forward. It was a good point in the end, and two games are on the agenda this week. On Wednesday we travel to Honiton in the Devon St. Lukes Bowl first round and then a six-pointer will follow at fellow early season strugglers Weymouth on Saturday.

The locals came out in good numbers to support their team, and the crowd included a fair amount of travelling support too, for this first round meeting in the Devon St Lukes Bowl between Honiton and the Yellows.

The management team rang the changes from Saturday's draw with Uxbridge as into the side came; Brooklyn Wilkins, Josh Salmon, Sergiu Lungu, Zack Williams, Jacob Wellington, Ise Aworinde and Finn Rooke. Player-manager Asa Hall and Toby Stephens sat this one out, with Dan Koita, Louis Jagger Cane, Aiden Horne, Tor Swann and Gabe Billington making up the full complement of substitutes.

When the game got underway,
Tiverton were quick to assume
possession, but the first sight of goal
came for the home side, but John
Ross's gloves were only lightly
warmed by a speculative effort as
early as the 5th minute. The Yellows
were moving the ball around nicely,
but their probing didn't threaten until
Zack Williams cut back was
dummied by Finn Rooke and just
evaded the advancing Corey Koerner
who had burst into the box. That
promising move occurred in the 10th
minute.

In the 20th minute Rooke challenged keeper Charlie Hawkins just inside his area, who was equal to the Tiverton strikers' physical threat and claimed the ball. A few minutes later, when the Yellows swung a corner in, the Hippos' keeper again showed good handling. Tivvy continued to see plenty of the ball, against a well drilled and hardworking Honiton side, though lacked a little incisiveness. A neatly assembled short corner routine from Lungu and Wellington, culminated in a rolled pass to Williams, though his shot was met with a good block.

Hot on the heels of that, in the 34th minute, was a free kick for the visitors, taken by Weston-super-Mare loanee Josh Salmon. This was the first save of any real note that Hawkins had to make and he moved well to parry the powerfully struck shot away.

In the 40th minute Wellington was chopped down on the flank, deep into Hippos' territory and from the resulting free kick, an inviting curling cross was sent in, but Honiton's backline held firm, and the half time whistle arrived, without the deadlock being broken. Tiverton had perhaps been a little too methodical and predictable before the break and they noticeably increased the tempo and intensity of their play, when the match resumed.

With their feet on the accelerator, an early corner was helped on at the

near post by captain Toby Down and narrowly landed the other side of the crossbar. A 55th minute corner was awarded to a more assertive Tiverton and although our hosts cleared to safety, Lungu soon produced a save from Hawkins, who got down to smother centrally. Our central midfield partnership on the night of Salmon and Lungu were taking control in the middle of the park. Lungu then tried another long-range effort that fizzed off the surface and just wide of the target. Rooke then put a good ball into the mix around the hour mark, but a foul was given to one of our onrushing players, who were looking to get on the end of it.

Tivvy's pressure finally told after that close escape. An excellent piece of vision from the ever more advanced Brooklyn Wilkins, found Jacob Wellington who clinically swept the ball into the corner of the goal from close range, with 65 minutes on the clock. That lead was doubled minutes later by the increasingly involved Wellington. This time he was the grateful recipient of a ball in from the other flank, sent in by Finn Rooke and his precise finish seemed to galvanise Asa Hall and Steve Orchard's men further.

Ise Aworinde was the next on the scoresheet, as the youngster broke through the East Devon side's

backline, to fire in off the post and in doing so notch his first senior goal for the club and the Yellows third of the evening. Ecstatic after that 75th minute goal, he was also to repeat Wellington's quick-fire brace, when his perseverance to win the ball in our hosts area paid off and he lashed the ball into the back of the net after it came back to him.

It was a much more convincing performance from Tiverton following the interval, although they did concede in the 90th minute, when Ross's save fell to former Tiverton development player Luke Paramore and he got a deserved consolation for the battling hosts. Tivvy are back on the road this Saturday, when they make the journey to Weymouth, in a six-pointer and will be very much intending to build on the momentum of their last two results, to achieve a favourable outcome.



MEET THE VISITORS

Poole FC were formed when two local teams, Poole Hornets and Poole Rovers, merged in 1890. Both teams had been in existence since 1880. Poole joined the Dorset League in 1896, then the Hampshire League in 1903. The club enjoyed success in the Dorset Senior Cup in their early years, winning it for the fifth time in 1907.

After several seasons without football because of the First World War, the club began playing again in the 1919–20 season under the name Poole & St. Marys. They changed their name back to Poole FC after one season. Poole joined the Western League in 1923. Poole won the Dorset Senior Cup again in 1926. The club also turned professional that year and joined the Southern Football League, Eastern Division. The 1926–27 season saw the club's best FA Cup run in its history. They reached the third round and played Everton, losing 3–1 at Goodison Park. They won the Dorset Senior Cup again in 1927 and reached the First Round of the FA Cup three consecutive seasons. Poole F.C. was unable to complete season 1929-30 in the Southern League due to financial difficulties[4] and left four games unfulfilled. In May 1930 a deficit of £4261 was reported and the club went into voluntary liquidation.

Two weeks later a new club under the name of Poole Town FC was created. Poole rejoined the Western League in 1930 and stayed there (except for the 1934–35 season) until 1957. In 1933, Poole moved into Poole Stadium. They became known as Poole Town in 1934. Poole Town reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup in 1946. They held Queens Park Rangers to a

2–2 draw before losing in the replay 6–0. They reached the first round again in 1963 and 1967, losing to Watford (after a replay) and Queens Park Rangers, respectively. The Main Stand at Poole Stadium was built by Club supporters for the Football Club in the 1950s. In 1994 the Dog Track was widened making the centre green too small for a regulation pitch. Poole Town were obliged to move on and find a new home.

In 1994, having been forced to leave Poole Stadium to make way for Poole Pirates speedway and greyhound racing Poole Town shared a ground with Hamworthy United for the 1995–96 season. They lost 39 consecutive matches, equalling the record set by Stockport County in 1977, and winning just 1 point from 42 league matches. The record was subsequently beaten by A.F.C. Aldermaston in 2010.[8] Poole Town were relegated from the Southern League and joined the Hampshire League Division One, sharing a ground with Holt United.

Poole won the Dorset Senior Cup for the 12th time in 1998. They also won the Hampshire League Cup and finished third in the league. They won the league cup again in 1999 and finished second in the league but were not promoted. The Hampshire League Premier Division was created for the 2000–01 season but Poole could not join because they did not have sufficient ground grading. They were effectively relegated, staying in the first division.

In 2008, Poole Town submitted plans for the creation of a new £1.2 million ground at Branksome Recreation Ground which would enable them to meet strict FA criteria to gain

CUSTOM METAL PLAQUE promotion to the Southern League Division One. However, In December 2009 the Poole Borough Council Planning Committee turned the plans down due to loss of open space policy and no perceived community benefit. The club switched to plan B and have since won planning permission for a £2–3M development at Canford Magna, adjacent to Canford Park Arena. Although a privately funded 3G pitch was built on the Canford Land, no work has yet commenced for the new stadium.

In the 2009-10 season Poole Town sold Charlie Austin to Swindon Town for an undisclosed sum.(estimated £180,000) Austin scored 46 goals in 46 games in his first season at Poole and 18 goals in 11 games before his transfer. He signed off with five goals in his last game against Moneyfields. Despite jumping six divisions, Austin continued scoring goals (eventually earning a transfer to Championship club Burnley and then Queens Park Rangers, playing at that time in the Premiership and with Charlie being one of the top scorers for the 2014–15 season). The 2009–10 season ended for Poole with another Wessex title but no promotion due to ground grading again.

During the 2010–11 season Poole Town won the Wessex League Premier Division for the third consecutive season and reached the semi-final of the FA Vase and the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup. In contrast to previous seasons, the club were granted promotion to the Southern League after FA agreed to them staging Southern League football at Tatnam following a temporary upgrade of the facilities.

The 2012–13 season saw the club promoted as champions of Southern League Division One South and West to the Premier division. The club completed a treble that season by winning the Dorset Senior Cup when they beat Wimborne Town 4–1 in the final and the Southern League Champions Cup, beating Burnham away 0–1. The Dolphins were also voted the Southern League SWD1 club of the season.

The 2013–14 season saw Poole miss out on the playoffs by just one point, having had three points deducted for playing an ineligible player during one match earlier in the season. The 2014–15 season saw Poole Town win the (Red Insure) Southern League Cup, beating Corby in the two legged final (on away goals). However, Corby had the last laugh as Poole missed out on the Championship on the last day of the season losing 2–3 at home to Corby who were second at the start of play on goal difference. The game was watched by a Tatnam record 2,203 crowd. The match had been billed as "Winner takes all" and the defeat consigned Poole to the Playoffs, where they lost in the semi-final at home to St Neots Town.

Tatnam was upgraded again in 2013 with the dugouts moved opposite the Main Stand, a new clubhouse, a third turnstile, 100 more seats including 50 in the small stand (which was moved), increased sizes for the dressing rooms, more toilets and a new changing facility for the officials, as well as a new stand at the Fleetsbridge End. The total upgrade cost over £200,000 and was completed in just over two months. The grading allows promotion to the National League South which they achieved at the end of the 2015–16 season.

Adam Parkes (Goalkeeper) The 25-yearold shot-stopper came through Southampton's academy after joining the Saints at the age of 10. Last season, after a spell with Taunton Town, Parkes signed for Gosport Borough under the management of Joe Lea and Pat Suraci and made 30 appearances at Privett Park.

Ben Taylor (Goalkeeper) Ben signed for Poole Town following trialling with the club during pre-season. An excellent shot-stopper who came through the academies of MK Dons and Cambridge United.

Josh McCormick (Defender) Josh started his career at Winchester after coming through the youth ranks. The right-sided defender had spells with Backfield & Langley and lifted the Sussex Senior Cup with Bognor Regis but has spent the majority of his career with the Citizens. He signed for the Dolphins for the start of the 2025/26 campaign.

Ryan Campbell (Defender) The 31-yearold defender, a summer signing, after spending eight years at the Webbswood Stadium and making just under 300 appearances. Ryan started his career through the ranks at national league south side Chippenham and made his debut for them in 2015.

Josh Staunton (Defender) Josh 'Staunts' Staunton is an experienced centre half who has over 200 National League appearances at the age of just 28, emphasising his remarkable experience and ability as a professional. Staunton signed for the Dolphins midway through the 2023/24 campaign and made his debut in a 2-0 defeat to Hayes and Yeading.

Jamie Whisken (Defender) The 36-year-old centre back is a fan-favourite at Poole Town; he was one several players that moved west to Poole Town from AFC Totton in the summer of 2013. He has made almost 500 appearances for the Dolphins over a span extending ten years and has captained the side for the majority of that time.

Harry Lee (Defender) The 19-year-old defender joined on dual-registration with Bromley this summer following his release from Brighton & Hove Albion at the conclusion of the 2024/25 campaign.

Corey Jordan (Defender) The 26-year-old is a natural centre half who can also be used as a right sided defender. Jordan started his career at AFC Bournemouth where he made his professional debut in a 3-2 defeat to Preston North End in the EFL Cup, replacing Tyrone Mings as a substitute.

Billy Lowes (Midfielder) Midfielder Billy Lowes is one of the most technically gifted players in his position, an energetic box to box midfielder with an eye for goal. Lowes started his semi-professional career with Poole Town FC as a 17-year-old.

Kris Campbell (Midfielder) Kris is a technically gifted winger with heaps of experience in the National League South. Born in Croydon, the 30-year-old started his career at nearby Bromley, initially as a goalkeeper before making the switch to defence at 17 years old. In the 2024/25 season, he made 29 appearances for the Beavers and scored on three occasions and secured eight assists and joined Poole in February.

Charlie Davis (Midfielder) A dynamic midfielder who was one of many signings made by Steve Tully for the 2024/25 campaign. The 28-year-old joined the Dolphins after an impressive season for Sholing where he racked up three goals and 13 assists. He is a cultured and versatile player who has gained the reputation of being a 'free-kick specialist' who has an eye for goal.

Selim Saied (Midfielder) The tricky winger joins the Dolphins from National League South Farnborough after making 91 appearances and scoring 15 goals in three years at Cherrywood Road. The 21-year-old started his career at youth level for National League outfit Woking.

Harvey Slade (Midfielder) Harvey is a 6'4 box to box midfielder who provides aerial threat and has an eye for goal with late runs into the box. He originally joined us on loan from Weymouth during the 2023/24 but agreed a contract with the Dolphins for the 2024/25 campaign.

Henry Spalding (Midfielder) The 26-year-old midfielder progressed through Bristol City's youth academy before signing for Marine in 2016. Shaquille Gwengwe (Forward) The 24-year-old centre forward was Joe Lea and Pat Suraci's eighth summer signing and joins us from the Magpies where he spent the previous three seasons. In the early stages of his footballing career, Gwengwe played for the likes of Worthing, Blackfield & Langley and Andover Town and saw success with sides rising through the non-league pyramid.

IK Hill (Forward) The 24-year-old winger becomes our fourth summer signing and joins us after an impressive individual season last campaign after recording 31 goal contributions in 45 matches. Last season, Hill found the back of the net on 22 occasions and also recorded nine assists over the course of the campaign in a Winchester side that suffered relegation.

Tyrrell Sampson (Forward) The 25-year-old winger joined Poole after scoring an impressive 58 goals and registering 44 assists in all competitions over the last two seasons and actually played for Poole as a teenager back in 2018 but only made a handful of appearances back then. After departing the club, he went on to sign for New Milton Town and subsequently AFC Stoneham where he enjoyed his best footballing spell, emphasised through his fantastic goal record.
