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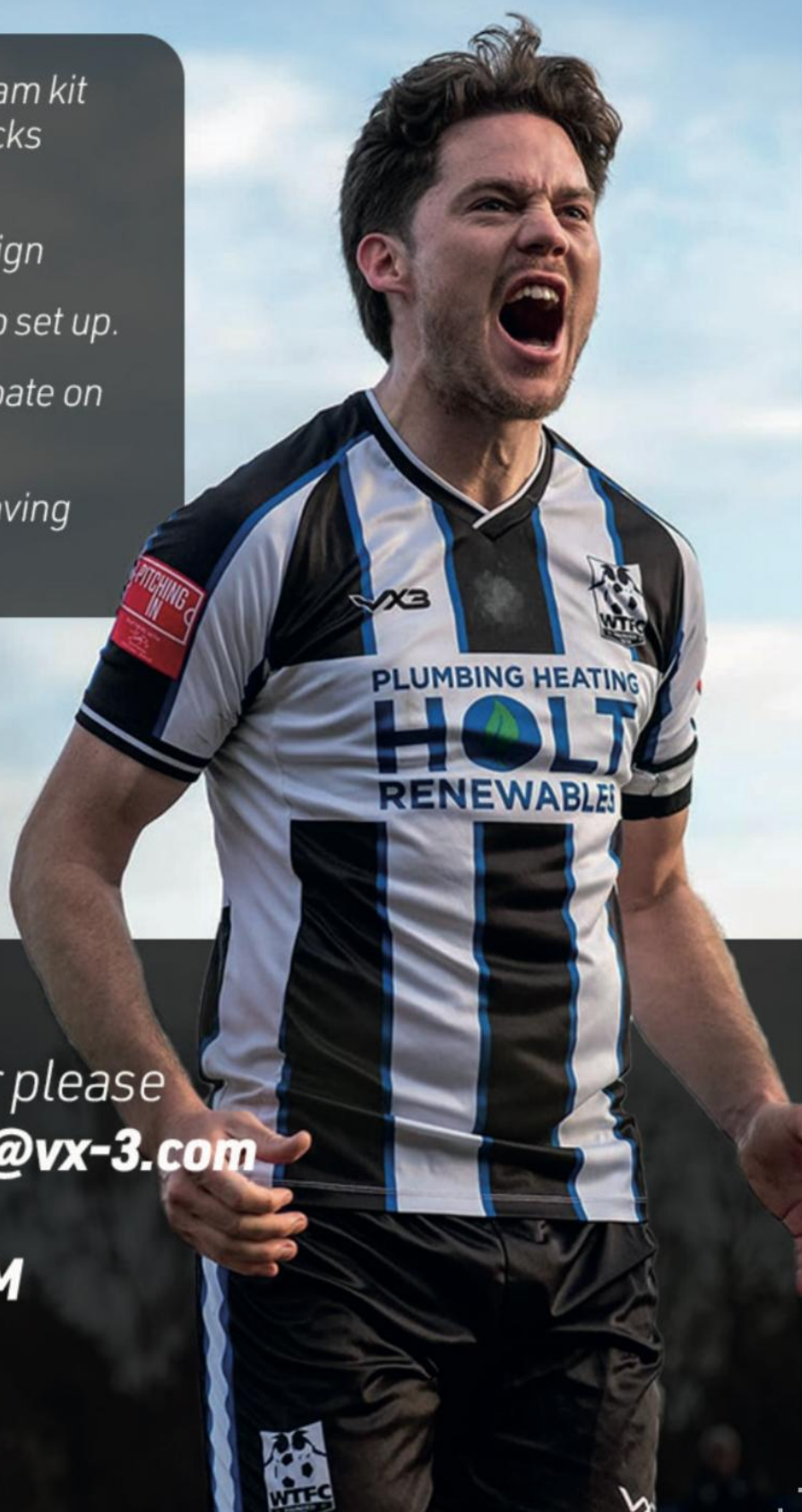

Going into this game the team had provided plenty of attractive football, spirit and promise, but without the rewards of victory, at the Slee Blackwell Solicitors Stadium. On Saturday all that was about to change.

Asa Hall and his assistant Steve Orchard's side have played a refreshing brand of football in the first month of the season. In the latest match they stayed true to that philosophy and this perseverance and belief paid dividends.

An enforced change due to the suspension of Matt Wood, meant Asa Hall slotting in alongside captain Toby Down in the centre of defence. Top scorer Louis Jagger Cane returning to the matchday XI with Aiden Horne taking up an attacking midfield role behind him and Dan Koita.

New signing from Taunton Finn Rooke was amongst the substitutes, as we lined up against Berkshire side Bracknell Town. The Robins had been involved in a successful FA Cup replay on Tuesday night against Chichester in Sussex with the Yellows also knowing that a win would mean going above our visitors in the league table.

Anyone sensing a circumspect start from Tiverton following a series of defeats, would have been surprised by how quickly the side were on the front foot and into their stride.

The opening five minutes saw Jagger Cane thwarted by the Bracknell Keeper Michael Eacott, as he clawed the ball away from

him, after he tried to round him in a one-on-one and then a last-ditch tackle was made on Swann as he entered the area and Jagger Cane almost connected with an overhead kick from a dangerous cross in.

In the 6th minute Tiverton made their early dominance count. A Toby Stephens corner caused trouble in the Robins box and following a goal bound effort being blocked, there was skipper Toby Down to hook home decisively from close range.



The Yellows lightning beginning to the game, was layered with swift passing on the deck and our visitors struggled with the pace of our link up play, Stephens and Billington stretching them with incisive and creative use of the ball in possession. That partnership in centre midfield had a strong influence throughout the game.

Tivvy continued their hold on the game throughout a half of football in terms of quality as good as anything seen in many years on home soil. They were relentless with their attacking intent and with or without the ball, the tireless running from Aiden Horne, amongst others, didn't give the Robins defence a minute's rest.

Down Bracknell`s left Tor Swann was displaying his full repertoire of skills, teasing and tricking his way into the box or progressing to the by-line and delivering countless crosses. He was a constant threat. In front of him Koita and Swann`s, intelligent movement and ability to bring others into the game, asked many questions of the visitors` backline.

The solid and organised quartet of Brooklyn Wilkins, Down, Hall and Corey Koerner gave the Yellows a strong base and it was, on the whole, a quieter afternoon for Tiverton`s number one George Burton.

In the 12th minute a rampant Tivvy, passed and weaved their way up the pitch and the quick footed Horne fired over at the end of another scintillating move.

Shortly afterwards though, Tivvy were given a reminder that the visitors were not about to roll over as a terrific opportunity fell to Dominican international full back, Jeanmal Prosper from a Robins` corner. His close-range effort though was turned onto the post by Burton.

In the 18th minute, following more flowing football from the Yellows, Koita was in on goal. Eacott however produced a sharp reflex save to deny him and then when the ball rebounded back to the Tivvy frontman his follow up was floated beyond the bar.

Just before the half hour mark, with the ball crossing the Bracknell goal line, we appeared to have extended our lead. The referee though spotted an earlier infringement in the congested area and the effort that had arisen from a corner was ruled out.

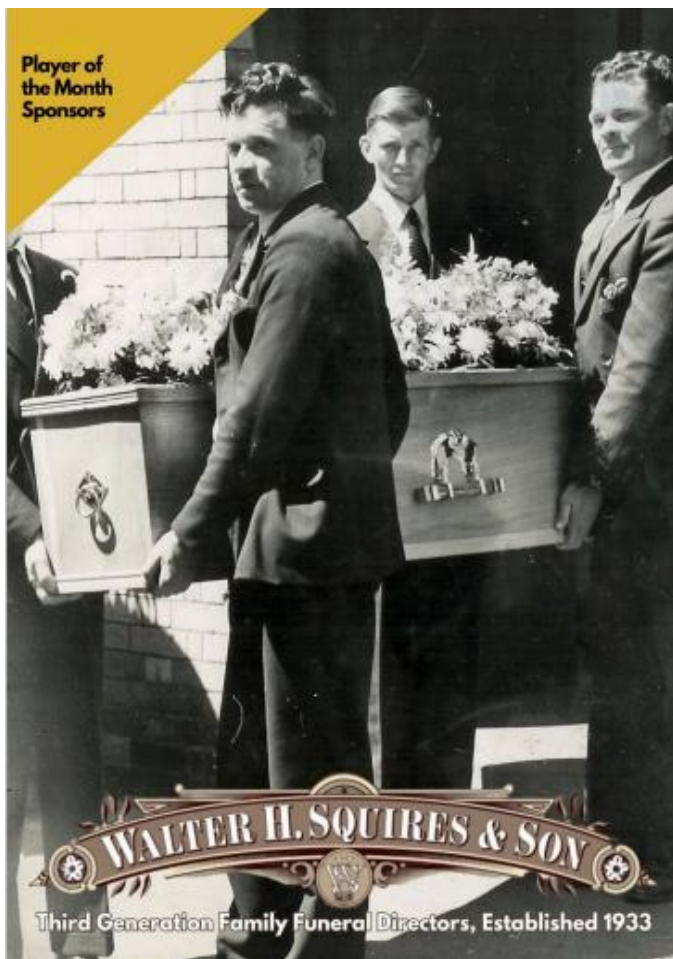
The lively Yellows though didn`t ease off and in the 42nd minute an early contender for goal of the month saw Koita and Stephens combine to great effect. Koerner sent Koita away down the flank and on collecting his searching pass, he held the ball up, cut inside and looking up, picked out Stephens on the edge of the eighteen-yard box. Using the pace of the ball, his low, hard shot disappeared rapidly into the bottom corner.

The 42nd minute second goal was almost cancelled out immediately, as within a minute, Haydon Vaughan`s excellent technical volley was a whisker over Burton`s crossbar. The half ended with Tiverton holding a two-goal cushion and they were very good value for that lead.



The Yellows continued to be in the ascendancy at the start of the second period, with the busy Horne neatly getting the ball out of his feet. Though his powerful, driven strike, sailed over the bar on 46 minutes, a defence splitting ball then saw Koita in the clear, though Eacott once again made himself big and Koita`s shot was palmed to safety.

Bracknell then managed to breach Tivvy's rear-guard, but a good chance was spurned as Alfie Pavey screwed his effort wide of the upright. On 53 minutes Maltese international Sam Magri took one for the team in tripping the escaping Tor Swann, who gave the Bracknell defence a torrid time throughout the afternoon.

The outstanding Stephens though was the instigator on many occasions, as Tiverton poured forward. There were other opportunities to put the game to bed. Jagger Cane found the side-netting from a tight angle and a Koita header spiralled wide.

This happening just prior to The Yellow's making their first change. In the 68th minute new signing Finn Rooke was brought on by Steve Orchard for Jagger Cane, who was one of many very good performers for Tivvy on the day.



Eacott was magnificent between the sticks for the visitors and he was very much Koita's nemesis. In the 73rd minute their personal battle resumed and once again it was the Bracknell Keeper who came out on top, as it opened up for the athletic striker and his shot was parried away.

The game became a little more end-to-end at that point. Horne whose work rate was

unmatched by anyone on the pitch and had some dynamic moments was replaced by Jacob Wellington with 80 minutes played.

With 85 minutes on the clock, a sweeping Tiverton move saw the sliding Koita nearly get on the end of a cross flashed across the six-yard box, it just evaded him. A vital interception from Hall shortly after that prevented Burton from being exposed to a one-on-one and potentially a nervy end to the game. Five minutes were added when 90 minutes were up and although The Robins threw caution to the wind, it was the Yellow's that came closest to completing the scoring.

Following a final substitution with Zack Williams on for the often-brilliant Swann, debutant Rooke flicked a header onto Koita in the channel. His reverse ball back to the ex-Willand and Taunton man was however, read by Eacott and he was down to smother.

A fantastic performance from Asa Hall and Steve Orchard's side was enjoyed by the Tivvy faithful. By virtue of that result, they climb out of the bottom three and move up to 15th. There will be an eagerness to build on Saturday's success, this Tuesday evening when they visit Yate in South Gloucestershire.

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Louis, when our media team caught up with him this summer, said: "Absolutely buzzing to get the opportunity to play for Tiverton again. Being a local lad from Willand and watching them lots as a kid, it's always been a goal to play for the club and after having a little spell here 6 years ago, I'm over the moon to be back again".

"Although last season at Sidmouth was an unbelievable one, both for me personally and for the club, when the opportunity came about for me to rejoin Tivvy, after speaking to Asa and Steve, I just couldn't say no to them".

Louis was at the Exeter City Youth Academy for 6 years and then spells in the men's game with Exeter College Academy, Topsham Town and Exwick Villa followed before he joined the Yellows for the first time.

His first spell with the club, when he joined from Exwick Villa in the summer of 2019, began promisingly with 3 goals in 3 matches during pre-season but he quickly found himself lower down the pecking order when the league campaign began, in terms of selection, behind the likes of Jared

Lewington, Chris Shephard & Olaf Koszela, and he moved on in September in search of regular playing time and he joined Buckland Athletic, but his time there was quickly curtailed by the Covid pandemic.

Spells at Bovey Tracey, Willand Rovers and Bideford followed, once football was allowed to resume, and during his shift at Silver Street, Louis was part of the side that made history for the club as they reached the First-Round proper of the FA Trophy for the first time.

Last season, at Sidmouth Town, Louis enjoyed arguably his best ever season, from both a personal and club perspective as he notched hugely impressive returns of 29 goals and 14 assists, which earned him a Players Player of the Season award and Sidmouth Town won a League & Cups treble for the first time in their history.

Despite not being a regular starter since rejoining this summer, Louis has already endeared himself to the Tivvy faithful by bagging four goals in four league starts, which included a brace in the Yellows impressive 3-1 win at Dorchester at the start of the current campaign.





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If you want to see some goals, it looks like Whitley Bay and Retford United are the places to be.

That was certainly the case in July and August. This season we're teaming up with the guys at Non-League HQ - find them on X - to bring monthly stats from across the Pyramid.

It promises to show a snapshot into how teams and players are performing each calendar month. Perhaps the table shows they're struggling but a deeper look may show a team is in fact one of the most in-form sides around.

Our first instalment shows Whitley Bay scored 27 times in the opening period of the season as did Retford at Step 6 - although Cranfield are just a goal behind them. Of course, Steps 1-4 started a little after Steps 5 and 6 but it will be fascinating to see how things unfold throughout the campaign.

We'll also be highlighting the players. At the end of August, the top scorer across Non-League football was Zak Khan. The Route One Rovers man hit 13 goals including three hat-tricks for the Northern Counties East League Division One side.

He was closely followed by Alnwick's Euan Potts and Step 5's leading scorer from Penrith, Luke Hunter, who both ended August on 12. Potts has also grabbed two trebles, while Hunter led the way when it

comes to consecutive games he scored in with nine. The closest player to that sequence is Oxhey Jets' James Barnett with six games on the spin.

It seems incredible the striker, who the Hoops recently signed from Wycombe Wanderers, was playing for Athletic Newham in the Essex Senior League a couple of years ago. The 22-year-old scored 125 goals for the Non-Leaguers while visa issues were sorted to allow him to move into the full-time game.

"I was playing against tough men week in, week out," he said. "It helped me discover how to overcome physical defenders." His rapid rise will be a real inspiration to so many. After all, goals pay the bills. And they also help draw in the crowds. Whitley Bay and Retford are certainly on our ones to watch in September !

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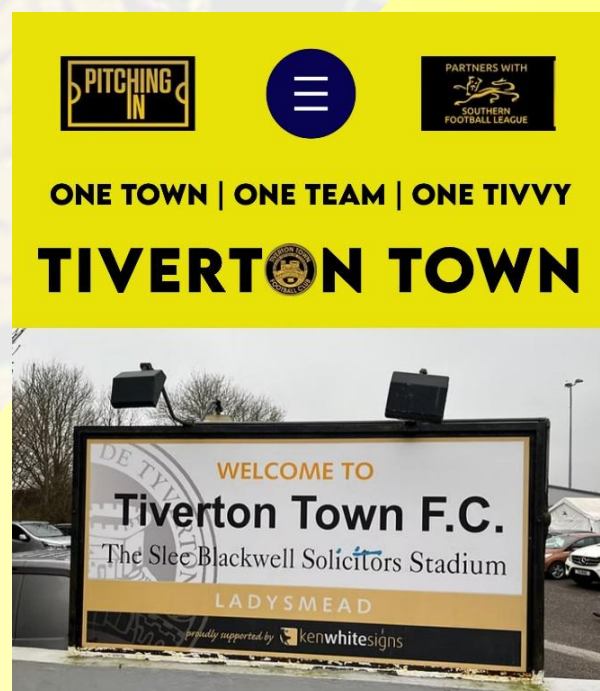
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MEET THE VISITORS

Mark Scott (Goalkeeper) Vastly experienced goalkeeper who joined The Reds in the summer from Ascot United. Previous clubs include Basingstoke Town, Swindon Town, Oxford City, Slough Town and Bracknell Town.

Kacper Orlowski (Goalkeeper) Young keeper who played for Binfield and Sutton Common Rovers last season. Kept a clean sheet against the Reds in April as the relegation bound Rovers pulled off a shock 1-0 win at Honeycroft.

Massimo Giamattei (Defender/Midfield) "Mas" was a regular member of the Chertsey Town side that won the Isthmian League South Central Division title in 2023/24. In his second season at Honeycroft and scored some important goals last season.

CJ Fearn (Defender) Joined the Reds from Farnborough in September 2024. Commanding defender who has over ten years' experience at Steps 2 & 3 of the football pyramid. Supporters and Players Player award winner last season.

Casey Bocarro (Defender) Made the left-back position his own last season after joining from Virginia Water. Tenacious defender who looks to get forward at every opportunity.

Kai Hobbs (Defender) Kai joined Uxbridge on a permanent deal last season, after impressing on loan from Basingstoke Town. All action defender who can play anywhere across the back four. Chipped in with some important goals in last season's push for promotion.

Cole Brown (Defender/Midfield) After making his Reds debut as a 19-year-old in 2017, Cole has rejoined the club from Chertsey Town. Attack minded player who has also represented Hayes & Yeading United, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Hendon. Made 40 appearances, scoring 10 goals in his previous season at Uxbridge.

Bernie Tanner (Defender) New signing from Enfield Town, where he scored in the 2024 Isthmian League Premier Division play-off final to secure Enfield's place at Step Two. Strong central defender whose experience at Step Three will be invaluable to The Reds

Olly Hamstead (Defender/Midfield) Joined in the summer from Hemel Hempstead Town. Young defender who is a former Player of the year at Chipstead. Has also played for Kingstonian and Burgess Hill Town.

KJ Osu (Defender) Young defender who has joined The Reds from Hanworth Villa. Has played in Belgium for KSV Roeselare as well as nearer home with Bracknell Town and Whitehawk.

Charles Stallard (Defender) Left sided defender who joined the Reds on a dual registration from Bedford Town in August. Former clubs include Sutton Common Rovers, Hayes & Yeading United, Walton Casuals and St Neots Town.

George Moore (Midfield/Forward) Attacking midfielder who joined us from Harrow Borough in 2023. Last season's top scorer with 21-goals. Was regularly amongst the goals at Step 3 with Harrow Borough and his winning goal in the Promotion final has already made him a club legend.



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Andrio Brandao (Midfield) Skilful, attacking midfielder who joined from Virginia Water in 2023. Always plays with a smile on his face and is improving with every game.

Harry Rush (Midfield) Harry was Captain of Hanwell Town during their promotion winning season in 2021/22, scoring 13 goals from midfield. Made his Reds debut last season on New Year Day and his performances were crucial in the Reds rise up the league during the later stages of the season.

Huw Dawson (Midfield) Young midfielder with experience at Steps 2 & 3 of the pyramid. Joined the club in August on a dual registration from Bedford Town, having previously played for Kettering Town and St Albans City.

Liam Tack (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who joined the club in the summer, having spent the last three seasons at Bracknell Town. His experience at step three will be invaluable to the squad. His previous clubs include Binfield, Ascot United, Hanwell Town and Thame United.

Fabio Sole (Midfield) Another player with links to Hanwell Town. Began his career as part of the Youth set-up at Oxford United. Step Three experience at Farnborough, Slough Town (Step Two), Hartley Wintney, Met. Police and Hanwell Town. Made his debut in November 2024 against Ashford Town (Middlesex).

Fope Deru (Midfield/Striker) Represented Huddersfield Town at Under 19's, 21's and B Team, before missing eighteen months through injury. 20-year-old attacking midfielder joined the club in August 2025.

Toby Nnadozie (Midfield) Into his second season at Honeycroft having joined from Rayners Lane in 2024. Combative midfielder who started his career at Risborough Rangers and has also represented Harrow Borough.

Dernell Wynter (Forward) Marked his debut at Sutton Common Rovers in February with a stunning goal. Joined The Reds from Rayners Lane and has previously represented Hanwell Town, Harrow Borough, Chesham United, Potters Bar Town, Northwood, St Albans City, Braintree Town, Enfield Town and Ware.

Rio Connell (Forward) Played for Rayners Lane and Northwood last season and his goals for the latter were instrumental in helping The Wood keep their place at Step Four. Began his career at Barnet, where he made two appearances for the Bees in the Middlesex Senior Cup.

Dan Rowe (Forward) Step 3 experience with Walton & Hersham, Walton Casuals, Hanwell Town, Basingstoke Town, Chertsey Town, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Gosport Borough. Joined in the summer having spent the last few months of last season at Kingstonian.



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In the late 19th century, the game of “football” was growing in popularity, and on the 3rd of February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr William Gardiner, was elected as the Club’s President and the club’s colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel.

Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set-up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours.

His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC. The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874, but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year. The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain

old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname “The Reds” was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final.

A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3. Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping “Town” from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit. Championship celebrations however were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow.

Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War. During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town. Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr W.S. Try.

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The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club.

During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1. This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963, and club found itself once again in Division

This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once against beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warm-up for the forthcoming World Cup campaign.

Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0. The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home.

In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today. Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time

in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC.

Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000. They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extratime, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals.

In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South-Central Division. In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager in over fifty years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18-years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019.
